

Instructions for connecting to the Guest Wireless Network


For your convenience, Guest wireless internet access is available in most common areas of the community. Please follow these instructions to connect to our network using the Windows XP or Windows Vista wireless utilities.

If you are using a different wireless program, or a different operating system, please follow the instructions in your system's documentation and connect to the "Guest" SSID. Lastly, follow the instructions on the last page of this guide.


1. Ensure that your laptop has wireless capabilities and that the radio is turned on. Please see your system documentation if you are not sure how to do this.

For Windows Vista (skip to the bottom of page 3 for Windows XP):


2. Right Click on this icon in the lower left hand corner of your screen -> 
3. Click on **Connect to a network** from the menu
4. On the following screen, double click on the **Guest** network that is circled




5. If you get the following message, click on **Connect Anyway**



6. Check the box for **Save this network** and for **Start this connection automatically** and click close




7. Click on the **Public Location** option and click close on the following screen



8. Skip to the All Operating systems section on the last page of this guide

For Windows XP:

2. Right Click on this icon in the lower right hand corner of your screen -> 
3. Click on **View available wireless networks** from the menu that comes up
4. Double click on the Guest network that is circled below




5. Click **Connect Anyway** on the following message and then close the above screen.



6. Open your default web browser (Internet Explorer, Firefox, Ect.)and attempt to go to any web page
7. Continue to all operating systems section

For all Operating systems:
