Android Power Saving Mode

Are you going to be in a situation where you need your phone battery to last longer than it normally does? Switch into **power saving mode**, which automatically cuts back on functions that may gobble up battery life.

- 1. Settings>Device Care>Battery.
- 2. Tap **Optimized** under **Power Mode**.
- 3. Optimized, Medium power saving, or Maximum power saving are available. There is also an Adaptive power saving option that sets the power mode automatically. Make your selection and back out.

TIRED OF LOOKING AT THE SAME OLD SHORTCUT ICONS ON YOUR WINDOWS 11 DESKTOP? Want to change them? Here's how:

- 1. Right-click the shortcut icon you wish to change.
- 2. Click Show more options.
- 3. Click **Properties**.
- 4. Click Change Icon . . .
- 5. Use the mouse pointer to scroll through the icons until you find the one you like.
- 6. Click on the icon.
- 7. Click OK>Apply>OK.
- 8. That's it!

Excel Tip—Use the Keyboard to Delete Row(s)

- 1. Highlight the row(s) you want to delete.
- 2. Hold down the **Control Key** and tap the **minus key**.
- 3. The rows disappear.

How to Adjust the Split Point Between Two Apps When Multitasking on iPad

By default, the **Slide Over** app or **secondary** app takes up 50 per cent of your iPad's screen when you launch the split screen mode. If you want to make the secondary app the primary or larger app or make it smaller, move the dark split line left or right and the screens will change size accordingly.

Tabbed Browsing

While reading an article or browsing a website, you may come across a link that interests you. Any link to another page can be opened in a *new tab* so it does not interrupt your reading. Here's how:


1. Hold down the Control Key and click the link; or

 If you have a mouse with a wheel, click the link by depressing the wheel instead of rolling it.
Either of the methods opens a link in a new tab. Close the new tab and you're back to your original page.

How to Display the Oldest Emails in Your Gmail Inbox



Oh, for Pete's Sake! How did I get 2,019 emails in my Gmail inbox? I wanted to take a look at the oldest emails, but I didn't know how to get to the end of my inbox. I googled *How to display oldest emails in Gmail inbox* and got my answer. Here's how:

- 1. Hover the mouse over the email counter in the upper right until a small menu drops down, and choose **Oldest**.
- 2. You'll be taken to the last page of emails in that folder.
- 3. Review your emails and delete the ones you no longer want.
- 4. To move to a previous screen to see newer messages, use the back arrow next to the email counter.

*ORDINARY **POWER STRIPS** ARE NOT **SURGE PROTECTORS**! Surge protectors do just what the name implies: protect your equipment from power spikes. Power strips also provide additional outlets, but they do not protect your equipment from power spikes. Surge protectors are more expensive than power strips, but they're worth the cost.
