"Mothers' Gifts"

³¹Then Jesus' mother and his brothers came, and standing outside they sent to him and called him. ³²A crowd was sitting around him, and they said to him, "Your mother and your brothers are outside asking for you." ³³And he replied, "Who are my mother and my brothers?" ³⁴And looking at those who sat around him, he said, "Here are my mother and my brothers! ³⁵Whoever does the will of God is my brother and sister and mother." Mark 3:31-35

My grandmother greeted the person with a pleasant "Hello"; I did not. She chastised me, telling me that just because I don't know the person is not a reason to not speak to that person.

These lessons of showing God's Love are still being learned.

God of All Love, fill us with your Spirit so that we can be Your servants in order to be Your hands and arms and feet and mouths to bring Your love and comfort and hope to others. Amen.
