PASSOVER—WHAT'S IN A NAME (Shakespeare)

Passover is one of the most significant festivals in the Jewish calendar. The name Passover (*Pesach*) is one of the four names of the coming holiday.

The names are:

Passover (Pesach פסח). The Spring holiday (Chag Ha-Aviv האביב). The matzot holiday (Chag Ha-Matzot הג המצות) and the freedom holiday (Chag Ha-Cherut חג החרות).

The holiday starts on the 15th of the month of Nisan when the moon is full.

- The name Passover is to commemorate "He (God) passed over the houses of the Israelites in Egypt" (Exodus 12, 27) sparing their first born.
- The Spring holiday "For it was in the month of spring that God freed you from Egypt." (Deut. 16, 1). This name highlights the agricultural aspect of the holiday. It is the beginning of the barley harvest in Israel, and the counting of the Omer (ספירת העומר).
- The Matzot holiday "And they baked unleavened cakes.... since they were driven out of Egypt in a hurry..." (Exodus 12, 37). "You shall observe the feast of unleavened bread" (Exodus 12, 17)
- "Zman Cherutenu" Time of our freedom "Remember this day on which you went free from Egypt, the house of bondage" (Exodus 13,3)

Not only does the holiday have four names, the number four appears in the Haggadah a few times: The four cups of wine. The four "Kushiot" (questions) of "Mah Nishtanah," and the four sons.

It is customary to explain the four cups for the four stages of the redemption by God: "and I took you out," "and I saved you," "and I redeemed you," "and I chose you to be my people" (Exodus 6, 6 & 7).

Passover is a festival rich in history and tradition. The Biblical and Talmudic sources emphasize the importance of remembering and retelling the story of the exodus from generation to generation "Mi-Dor Le-dor מדור לדור".

Food for thought and something to discuss at the seder (there is no official answer to the question). Moses is not mentioned in the *Haggadah* at all, Why?
