THE JEWISH CALENDAR הלוח העברי

We always complain: "The High holidays are very early this year." "Passover is late." So, what is wrong with the Jewish Calendar? Nothing, Gurnisht.

The Jewish Calendar is a lunar one, like the Muslim's, but it is also a solar calendar, or as it is called: lunisolar. Why? Let me explain.

The Jewish month has 29 and a 1/2 days. The time that the moon revolves around the earth. So, one month has 29 days, and the following month has 30 days and so on.

This number multiplied by 12 months makes 354 days. A short year by 11 days compared to the general calendar that is 365 days.

The Muslim year has 354 days. Therefore, Ramadan is sometimes in the summer, sometimes in the fall etc.

Since the Holidays of Pesach, Shavuot and Sukkot, the three pilgrimages, שלושה רגלים, are also agricultural holidays and depend on the seasons of the year, the Jewish calendar had to be adjusted according to the solar year.

Passover has to be in the spring. "For it was in the month of spring that God freed you from Egypt" (Deut. 16,1), It is also the beginning of the barley harvest, ספירת העומר.

Shavuot is seven weeks after Passover. "You shall count off seven weeks..." (Deut. 16:9). "You shall observe the feast of weeks, of the first of the wheat harvest." (Exodus 34, 22) and "The first fruit of your soil, ביכורים, you shall bring to the Temple." (Exodus 34, 26).

Sukkot has to be in the fall. "The feast of gathering, הג האסיף, at the turn of the year." (Exodus 34, 22).

In order to overcome this problem, the Jewish calendar added an extra month which we call Adar II. Every 19 years we add 7 times an extra month—Adar II.

If you are not sure about your Jewish date of birth, every 19 years since the day that you were born, the general calendar and the Jewish one will be on the same date that you were born (ages; 0, 19, 38, 57, 76 and "Big 120").

No matter what, we will continue to complain about the dates of our holidays but at least now we know the reason why.
