## "Decently and in Order"

<sup>33</sup> For God is not a God of confusion but of peace.

<sup>39</sup> So, my brethren, earnestly desire to prophesy, and do not forbid speaking in tongues; <sup>40</sup> but all things should be done decently and in order.

1 Corinthians 14:33, 39-40 (RSV)

I grew up and was raised in the Presbyterian Church in a small city near Tulsa, Oklahoma. As a young adult I wandered away from the church but attended with my family during visits in Dallas and Houston, and then back in Tulsa after they retired. It may have been during those years or maybe when I restarted going to church when I lived in New York City when I heard the phrases said to be typical of Presbyterians – "frozen chosen" congregation and a denomination that always does things "decently and in order".

I remember being surprised when I first read the passage in 1 Corinthians 14. I shouldn't have been surprised, but I was when I read the verses in one of Paul's letters. The opening sections of the PC(USA) Book of Order (the constitution for the denomination) are Biblically based, which is so very appropriate and reassuring.

The Protestant Fellowship is organized at Ann's Choice as an official group with a constitution which specifies our purpose, membership, a council with the responsibility to manage the activities of the Fellowship, processes for meetings, and a process for amending the constitution. Currently there are only eight voting members on the Protestant Fellowship Council and twelve is the number specified in the constitution. Additional council members are needed so that the council can effectively do its work for the Protestant Fellowship. If you are interested in serving on the Council, you may have questions about that. Feel free to talk to any of the current Council members; they are listed on page four of this newsletter.



# Special Meeting of the Protestant Fellowship: The Protestant Fellowship Council has called a special meeting of the Protestant Fellowship immediately following the worship service on Sunday, February 11.

The purposes of the meeting are 1) to act on the proposed amendment to the Constitution of the Protestant Fellowship to allow Council members who have been off the Council for less than one year to be elected to a one-year term, and 2) to elect additional members to the Protestant Fellowship Council.

The purpose of the proposed amendment is to provide a means of addressing the current and potential future shortage of elected Council members.

The Protestant Fellowship is composed of any residents of Ann's Choice who participate in the activities (including worship) of the Protestant Fellowship.
