



When God began to create the heavens and the earth, The book of Genesis has always fascinated me. Where did we come from? aminot as knowledgeshie as I would like to be that I do a lot of reading. As I understand it, for many years it was generally thought that our universe- the one we inhabit - was static and had always existed. Feel free to correct me if am wrong. Then astronomers were able to build bigger and better telescopes more powerful and able to reveal more and more of the information that was not previously available. Suddenly, they realized that the universe was continuously expanding and that there was a "beginning," just as the King James Bible tells us - "in the beginning" there was God. Think about it: witho the benefit of hi-tech tools, the writer was able to tell us in detail about the beginning. Was this the gift of revelation? Now we have what we call the Big Rang Theory-the instant when all the universe was compressed to the size of n head: God spoke and creation began.

One night, he invited me and my rlend to his back yard to view the marvels of space through his fantastic telescope. As I recall, we started with the moon and progressed to some stars that he knew but we clidn't. In those days, the view wasn't all that detailed - bu impressive to our young minds. I never forgot that experience. In those days the night sky was much different — the bright city light had not blotted out all the stars. Although I was not affluent enough to join the Boy Scouts, I did manage to buy their handbook and learned some things about the night sky. could pick out the Big Dipper, the North Star, and some constellations. 
Second Saturday Cinema Presentation in October


Reminder – Hearing Loop System in Chapel

- A couple of years ago when new carpeting was installed in the chapel, a hearing loop system was installed.
- •A T-coil, or telecoil, is a small copper coil in a hearing aid that functions as a wireless antenna that links to the "hearing loop" system.
- It results in significantly improved listening by making speech much clearer.
- It is an option on most hearing aids.




Communion on Sunday, March 3






- Save the Date: Community Christmas Service


