



- Spotlight on Mission Operation Christmas Child
- Operation Christmas Child is a ministry of Samaritan's Purse.
- "The mission of Operation Christmas Child is to demonstrate God's love in a tangible way to children in need around the world. Through this project, Samaritan's Purse partners with the local church worldwide to share the Good News of Jesus Christ and make disciples of the nations.", from the website.



- Spotlight on Mission Operation Christmas Child
- In the summer of 1993, Samaritan's Purse
 President Franklin Graham received a call from a
 man in England asking if he'd be willing to fill
 shoeboxes with gifts for children in Eastern Europe.
 Franklin agreed, but figured Christmas was months away.
 He forgot about the promise until he received a call back
 around Thanksgiving asking about the gifts.



- Spotlight on Mission Operation Christmas Child
- Franklin asked his friend, the late Pastor Ross Rhoads of Calvary Church of Charlotte to see if he could help with the need. A Sunday shortly afterward, Pastor Rhoads demonstrated for his congregation how to fill a shoebox with simple gifts and encouraged them to include a letter to the child as well. Within weeks, the church had 11,000 shoeboxes lining their hallways.



- Spotlight on Mission Operation Christmas Child
- Due to their generosity and additional gifts from Canada, Samaritan's Purse sent 28,000 shoebox gifts to children in the Balkans that Christmas.
- Since 1993, more than 232 million children in more than 170 countries and territories have received a shoebox. The project delivers not only the joy of what, for many kids, is their first gift ever, but also gives them a tangible expression of God's love.



Operation Christmas Child

- We have been collecting gift items the past few weeks. This past Thursday, **seventy** shoeboxes were packed.
- •Our donations will be shipped to a central location and then, along with thousands of other shoeboxes, distributed to needy children around the world.







- Operation Christmas Child
 - This is an overview of the items -
 - Personal care items (i.e., comb, washcloth, brush, bar soap, adhesive bandages)
 - Clothing for children (i.e., shirts, socks, scarf)
 - School and craft supplies





- Operation Christmas Child
 - Overview of the items continued -
 - Small toys (i.e., finger puppets, toy cars, etch-a-sketch, small balls)
 - A "WOW" item, such as a stuffed animal, harmonica or recorder.
 - NO toy weapons or violence-related toys.
 - Also, no liquids, creams or toothpaste.





- Operation Christmas Child, continued
 - A more complete list of acceptable items for donation may be found on the AC Resident Website
 - Donations of these items may be placed in specially marked boxes on Sunday afternoon in the Narthex of the Ann's Choice Chapel.
 - Cash donations and checks made out to "A. C. Protestant Fund" and marked "Operation Christmas Child" to purchase additional items for the shoeboxes.



- Spotlight on Mission Life Abundant
- Through Bible-based teaching, compassionate mentoring, and collaborative partnerships, Life Abundant guides individuals to break free from cycles of incarceration, offering hope, practical God's redemptive love to belother them thrive as process.
 - God's redemptive love to help them thrive as productive members of society.
- From 2018 to 2024, the Protestant Fellowship has donated \$ 11,000 to Life Abundant.



Reminder – Hearing Loop System in Chapel

- A couple of years ago when new carpeting was installed in the chapel, a hearing loop system was installed.
- •A T-coil, or telecoil, is a small copper coil in a hearing aid that functions as a wireless antenna that links to the "hearing loop" system.
- It results in significantly improved listening by making speech much clearer.
- It is an option on most hearing aids.


Communion on Sunday, March 3








- Fifteen volunteers from all faith groups at Ann's Choice participated in this ministry project.
